From the desk of Mandy Harrell Executive Director



Greetings,

As we end the first quarter of 2025, I want to update all of you on our work at Christian Family Services. We spent time in January preparing for our annual licensing review, which went smoothly and ended with a successful license renewal in February. Our review specialist was very complimentary and encouraging, which was a relief since it was my first review.

We hosted a training in January for prospective adoptive families and trained volunteers on adoption in February at Sira, a local pregnancy center. In addition, we met with the University of Florida's new Perinatal Mobile Clinic, and were able to help a mother with a newborn in the NICU with some parenting and transportation needs.

Sadly, one of the mothers we had been working with experienced a stillbirth in February. CFS supported this mother in her time of need and assisted with burial costs. Please pray for comfort and healing for this mother. We are currently working with several other expectant mothers who have made adoption plans. We have prioritized working with the fathers as well, and a few of them have chosen to support the expectant mothers' decisions and signed the necessary legal paperwork to allow the adoption plans to proceed uncontested.

We also welcomed intern Taylor Stiff, who is a member of CampusView Church. She is a senior at the University of Central Florida, and has jumped right in to help with many things. We continue to spend time meeting with pregnancy centers, hospitals, and other potential referral sources. Please pray that CFS will be considered when these places have parents who would benefit from our services.

On April 12, we are cohosting a training on open adoption with Caring Choices, another local agency. We look forward to continuing to serve women with unplanned pregnancies as they decide what is best for their children. Thank you for your prayers and support.

She hopes to use her degree to enhance the mental health field, counsel the community and be a safe space for God's people. BRIDGING THE GAP

On March 7, I had the privilege of hosting the Christian Family Services booth at a special event to benefit the Pregnancy Care Center in Lake City. The event, titled Bridging the Gap: From Brokenness to Healing, was organized by my talented friend, Afton Brown. It was an evening of truth, beauty and hope. The guest speaker of the night, Dr. Patti Giebink, MD, traveled from Sioux Falls, SD to share her journey from abortion doctor to passionate advocate for life. After her moving words came the premiere of the short documentary Beyond the Ultrasound, which offered a behindthe-scenes look at the Pregnancy Care Center and highlighted the incredible work done by pregnancy centers every day. The evening also featured the debut of Afton Brown's music video "I Didn't Know (Luna's Story)," which portrayed her personal journey of healing after abortion. The program included beautiful dance performances, accompanied by women sharing cardboard testimonials about their experiences with placing a child for adoption, miscarriage, infant loss, and abortion. Afterward, attendees enjoyed a meet-and-greet market featuring local vendors and resources for women facing unplanned pregnancies.

My favorite part of the evening was seeing the involvement of so many young people. Sebastian Talley, a talented high school entrepreneur, served as both Director and Director of Photography for the documentary "Beyond the Ultrasound" and the "I Didn't Know" music video.
